What is R.C.I.A.?

R.C.I.A. stands for Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. It is a process through which adults complete and celebrate their Initiation in the Catholic Church.

Is R.C.I.A. for me?

What happens at a Tuesday evening session?

- 1. We start with prayer. As the year progresses we learn various Catholic prayers and their meaning and various Catholic ways of praying.
- 2. We read the Gospel reading for the upcoming Sunday. We explore the meaning of these Scripture passages and look at what they say for our life now. They are guides for the Catholic Spiritual life.
- 3. We have a strong knowledge component striving to learn Catholic beliefs and practices. Each night a different topic will be presented. Some topics will be: What Makes Us Catholic; Catholic Church Structure; Mary and the Saints; the Sacraments; the Catholic Creed; etc.
- 4. We form a small community knowing that becoming Catholic is about joining a people who are striving to make Jesus known and loved.

We do what the Church asks of people joining – go to the Cathedral to meet the Archbishop, participate in a retreat, celebrate rites with the Eucharistic community on Sundays.

We listen to God and let our hearts and minds be formed and shaped in His way of life for us.
